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Queensland Jubilee Championships - This Weekend

The Tingira Boat Club will host the Inaugural Queensland Championships for Jubilee One-Design Class Yachts this weekend.

Sailing Master Ian Waller-Wilkinson and his sailing sub-committee have been busy planning for this special event. The event was originally scheduled for earlier this year but became a victim of the COVID 19 Restrictions. Now that those restrictions have been somewhat eased the event is now set to go this weekend.

There are expected to be up to nine Jubilees participating in the regatta. Each boat will have a crew of two or three.

The regatta will take place on the western side of Macleay Island and be quite visible from the Clubhouse. Two different courses have been planned to allow for different wind directions.

The regatta will consist of a series of three races on Saturday and three races on Sunday.

All races will start and finish at the Club pontoon *Tingira*.

Neville Prosser, Dudley Kavanagh and Don Noble have volunteered to be the race officials and be responsible for starting and finishing the races and recording the results.

Keeping an eye on the safety of the sailors will be our two safety boats *Sandpiper* and *Tango*. Safety crews rostered for the weekend are Moss Lane, Bob Stampton, Max Keily and Peter Lawson.

Helping out with communications will be Ruth Venner who will operate the Tingira land-base VHF radio and mobile phone calls while Neville Prosser will be monitoring the VHF radio and mobile phone calls on the pontoon.

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Following the races on both days, food and refreshments will be available for the sailors and officials at the Clubhouse. A number of the sailors will be travelling from the mainland and our Club bus will be made available to pick-up and return our visitors to the Macleay Island jetty.

On Sunday afternoon the regatta will conclude with a presentation of trophies and prizes to the winning crews. Other awards include a trophy for the wooden boat with the fastest times. I am sure that the sailors will stay on afterwards to enjoy some Tingira hospitality.

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The Jubilee One-Design Class Yacht

The 18ft Jubilee Class was developed in 1935 to sail on Port Phillip Bay in Victoria. There are strong fleets still sailing at the Ballarat Yacht Club, Royal Brighton Yacht Club and the Sorrento Sailing Couta Boat Club in Victoria. They are also sailed in Sydney. Currently there are nine of these boats sailing in our own Southern Moreton Bay area.

The local Jubilees are a mixture of the traditional timber boats and more recent fibreglass boats. Jubilees are usually sailed with a crew of three and owing to their one design nature provide exciting and close racing. The Jubilees have a swing centreboard making them ideal for the shallow waters of Moreton Bay.

Covid 19 Update (August 24, 2020)

With the sudden outbreak of Covid-19 cases south of Brisbane the Queensland Government has acted quickly to control the spread of the virus.

Restrictions have been put in place to limit the number of people gathering in areas to 10 inside and out.

However, because we elected to operate under Covid Industry Safety Plans we are exempt from these restrictions and therefore continue to operate as we have been doing. We operate under two plans, the Industry COVID Safe Plan for Queensland Hotels and Clubs and the Aquatic Sports Sector COVID Safe Plan. They are both explained elsewhere in this newsletter along with a specific plan designed to suit our requirements.

Stage 3 – Easing of Restrictions Plan

The Industry Plans have been updated to Stage 3 requirements

As of noon, July 3, 2020, the Queensland Government has eased the Corona Virus restrictions to Stage 3.

With all businesses allowed to open, this will allow Queensland to open up, so people can start to get back to normal; a new normal.

The most important thing that we must continue to observe is the **Social Distancing rules**: 1.5 meters between people and allowing, in most cases, 4 square meters per person.

So far Queensland has escaped a second wave of the Corona Virus because we have observed the restrictions laid down by our

Government. If we continue to obey the rules, we will progress forward, and we will **not** finish up like Victoria.

Our Club

We shall continue to operate in line with the Industry COVID Safe Plan for Queensland Hotels and Clubs.

However, we still need to have our own Plan to cover our specific conditions and this is updated in the following information.

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From Friday July 10 the following will apply:

- The main area and deck will be classed as one area rather than two as was required in Stage 2.
- Limitations of numbers: for areas less than 200 square meters, 2 square meters per person is allowed with a limit of 50 people. We can therefore seat up to 50 people on a Friday night.
- Members only, no guests.
- Bookings! Names on the white board. No phone bookings except those not on Macleay Island.
- **Seating as arranged. No extra chairs or tables to be added unless approved by the Commodore.**
- Food will be served straight to tables.
- **Dirty plates to be returned to the designated tables for collection by kitchen staff.**
- Drinks may be purchased from the bar; however social distancing must be observed, 1.5 meters.
- Follow the marks on the floor when in line to observe Social Distancing.
- Bar opening time 6.00 p.m. (Friday)
- Kitchen staff only in the kitchen.
- Follow marks on the floor while in line, when paying for your meal.
- Use credit/debit cards etc, instead of cash where possible.
- Names of those attending will have their names listed, as is customary. As only members are in attendance, addresses and mobile numbers are readily available from Club register if required,
- If you are ill, stay home, do not come to the Club.
- Download the COVID Safe App.
- **Observe instructions from the Commodore and Management Committee members.**

Observe Social Distancing Rules as instructed by the Driver.

Courtesy transport must be frequently cleaned and disinfected between uses.

Social distancing must be maintained as far as possible during use. A contact information list must be kept for members travelling on the bus for contact tracing purposes, including name, address, and telephone number for a period of at least 56 days.

Boating

Stage 3 has also opened sporting activities. From our perspective, we can open more of the boating side of our Club.

By aligning the Club with the Aquatic Sports Sector COVID Safe Plan we can extend our operations to Dragon Boats, x6 Outriggers (OC6) and Sailing Boats.

Dragon Boats: Back to 20 Paddlers.

OC6: Six Paddlers.

Sailing Craft: Vagabonds. Two people per craft placed to observe Social Distancing requirements.

- All personnel visiting the Club for any reason, regardless of if they are using the Clubs equipment or as a spectator must provide their name, address and mobile number which will kept at the Club for 56 days in case of a COVID-19 outbreak.

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- A list of all paddlers in each boat to be kept for 56 days.
- Also, their destination and stopping points must be recorded.
- All shared equipment must be sanitised after each use.
- If you are ill, do not come to the Club.
- **Observe Social Distancing at all times, 1.5 meters.**
- Download the COVID Safe App
- Provide sanitising stations
- **Observe instructions from the Boating sub-committee and Management Committee members.**

This plan may change from time to time as requirements are altered.
