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Results of the 16th Calvert Memorial Sailing Event

A total of 11 yachts nominated to participate in this year's annual Calvert Memorial Sailing Event. The fleet was a mix of mono and multihull yachts ranging in size from 6 to 11 metres in length.

With an early start time of 9:00am, it was pleasing that a light breeze had already developed and was blowing from the north. The start/finish crew on the Tingira pontoon initiated the start sequence at the scheduled time and it proceeded smoothly. At 9:10am the start flag dropped and the yachts were away, sailing northward to complete the 20 km triangular course set between Macleay, Peel and North Stradbroke Islands.

The first leg towards the Peel Island Cardinal Mark/Weather Station beacon was a windward work. The yachts were able to make the most of the light northerly breeze (about 5 - 7 knots) as they were assisted by an outgoing tide. With the boats tacking to and fro to windward the fleet spread out making it difficult to judge how the yachts were placed. *Tucanu* was first to round the Peel Island Cardinal Beacon and was closely followed by *Skirmish*. Next were the two Jubilee Yachts *Isobel* and *Andiamo*.

The next leg of the course was eastward towards Stradbroke Island. Spinnakers were set and although the breeze was still light the yachts made fairly steady progress across the paddock. *Tucanu* and *Skirmish* arrived at where the Stradbroke Island turning buoy should have been, but found no sight of it. After a quick check with the Tingira Pontoon via VHF radio the advice given was to round the 'invisible' mark and head back to Dalpura and the finish line.

Tucanu and *Skirmish* made a grand sight as they gybed their spinnakers and returned home on a fairly tight shy run.

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It was a great sight seeing the fleet returning southward with colourful spinnakers set. The multihull *Tucanu* crossed the finish line with a winning time of 2hrs 33 minutes and 57 seconds and was closely followed by the first monohull *Skirmish* with an elapsed time of 2 hrs 36 minutes and 25 seconds. Only 2 minutes and 28 seconds separated the first two boats home. *Isobel* was third over the line and was the first of the Jubilee class yachts to finish, with *Andiamo* very close behind. *Celeste* (Paul Driver) and *Sirius* (Mike Stephens) made for a very exciting and close finish. ***Celeste* crossed the line only 3 seconds ahead of Sirius.**

It was lucky our timekeepers Marion Mori and Don Noble were on the ball and had eyes like an eagle. *Nereid* crossed the line next with skipper, Mike King, lamenting a broken spinnaker pole. *Brahminy Sea Nymph* crossed the line next sporting a very colourful red, white and blue spinnaker. It was Deb and Justin's first sail with Tingira - and we hope that they will sail with us again. John Simpkin crossed the line next in *Sonsie Lass*. He spent much of the race 'whistling for the wind' so that his Herreshoff 28 ketch would get up and go. Ivan Scott and crew Jan Elston aboard *Orca 2* was the last to cross the line. Ivan also had been 'whistling for the wind' as his Jarcats would have relished a much stronger breeze.

All in all it was a very pleasant day out on the water and great to be amongst such friendly 'boating' folk.

Covid-19 Easing of restrictions November 17, 2020

With further easing of the Covid 19 restrictions by the Queensland Government, our Club will be able to accommodate more people for our Friday night dinners. Up until now we have been operating under the rule that premises with an area less than 200 sq. meters could use the one person per two square meter rule with a maximum of 50 people.

The government has removed the 50 people limit, which allows us to have 70 people under our roof.

I suggest that for normal members dinners we set the limit at 60 depending on the chefs and 70 for Fish and Chip nights. To control our numbers especially for fish and chips, prebooking is essential and names must be placed on the board by lunch time Thursday.

As far as social distancing is concerned the current table configuration should be retained but two extra chairs be added to allow eight people at a table rather than six.

The Queensland Government has done an excellent job retaining this Virus, however our greatest enemy is complacency.

Tingira Boat Club Inc. Stage 5 – Easing of Restrictions Plan

Our Club

We shall continue to operate in line with the Industry COVID Safe Plan for QUEENSLAND HOTELS, CLUBS, NIGHTCLUBS and ADULT ENTERTAINMENT

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However, we still need to have our own Plan to cover our specific conditions and this is updated in the following information.

From Friday November 20 the following will apply:

- Limitations of numbers: The 2 square meters per person rule will allow us to seat 70 people inside the clubrooms.
- Members and their guests only.
- Bookings! Names on the white board. (Members and guests of members) No phone bookings except those not on Macleay Island.
- **Seating to continue to be set up as it has been, however now eight chairs can be around each table.**
- Food will be served straight to tables.
- **Dirty plates to be returned to the designated tables for collection by kitchen staff.**
- Drinks may be purchased from the bar. You may eat and drink while standing.
- Follow the marks on the floor when in line to observe Social Distancing.
- Bar opening time 6.00 p.m. (Friday)
- Kitchen staff only in the kitchen.
- Follow marks on the floor while in line, when paying for your meal.
- Use credit/debit cards etc, instead of cash where possible.
- Names of those attending will have their names listed, as is customary. Members in attendance, will have their addresses and mobile numbers readily available from Club register if required. Guests of members however will need to have listed their names, addresses/email address and telephone number.
- If you are ill, stay home, do not come to the Club.
- Download the COVID Safe App.
- **Observe instructions from the Commodore and Management Committee members.**

Courtesy Bus Ring Moss 0428 717 535

Observe Social Distancing Rules as instructed by the Driver.

Courtesy transport must be frequently cleaned and disinfected between uses. Social distancing must be maintained as far as possible during use.

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A contact information list must be kept for members travelling on the bus for contact tracing purposes, including name, address, and telephone number for a period of at least 56 days.

Boating

Stage 3 has also opened sporting activities. From our perspective, we can open more of the boating side of our Club.

By aligning the Club with the Aquatic Sports Sector COVID Safe Plan we can extend our operations to Dragon Boats, x6 Outriggers (OC6) and Sailing Boats.

Dragon Boats: Back to 20 Paddlers.

OC6: Six Paddlers.

Sailing Craft: Vagabonds. Two people per craft placed to observe Social Distancing requirements.

- All personnel visiting the Club for any reason, regardless of if they are using the Clubs equipment or as a spectator must provide their name, address and mobile number which will kept at the Club for 56 days in case of a COVID-19 outbreak.
- A list of all paddlers in each boat to be kept for 56 days.
- Also, their destination and stopping points must be recorded.
- All shared equipment must be sanitised after each use.
- If you are ill, do not come to the Club.
- **Observe Social Distancing at all times, 1.5meters.**
- Download the COVID Safe App
- Provide sanitising stations
- **Observe instructions from the Boating sub-committee and Management Committee members.**

This plan may change from time to time as requirements are altered.
